Readings for June 4, Pentecost Sunday

1st Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11... The disciples are filled with the Holy Spirit when a strong driving wind fills the house in which they were and what appeared to them tongues of fire that rested on each of them, and they began to speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13...The same Spirit resides in everyone but is manifested in each person with specific gifts for some benefit.

Gospel Reading: John 20:19-23...On the evening of his resurrection, Jesus appears to the disciples gathered together in a locked room and greets them. "Peace be with you. As the Father has send me, so I send you." Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." and he gives them the power to forgive and retain sins.

Question for reflection: How are you using your spiritual gifts for the benefit of others?

By devotion to my Heart, tepid souls shall grow fervent.


Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
