

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Saint Colman, Good Shepherd, Saint John Fisher, Saint Jude the Apostle, Madonna del Castello, Saint Maurice and Word of God Parishes:

On April 12, 2015, when I initiated *On Mission for The Church Alive!*, who of us could have ever imagined the ways in which the COVID-19 virus and crisis would affect every aspect of our daily lives? As we continue to live through many changing realities, please know that I pray for you daily asking our Heavenly Father to shower you with abundant grace, good health and much hope.

Despite present challenges with the pandemic, your parishes completed the merger process of consultation with parishioners, and members of your Pastoral and Finance Councils signed a petition to move forward with the merger plan. In turn, your grouping administrator, Father Frank Almade, petitioned me to merge the parishes. On May 7, 2020, the diocesan Priest Council and Vicars General gave consent to the proposal, and I have accepted these recommendations.

Your priests and deacon have worked diligently in service to you and to God throughout this process, and I am deeply grateful for their care and leadership.

This has not been a simple task. Jesus never promised that it would be easy to carry his message of love and mercy to others. He was clear that sacrifice would be necessary. However, you are positioning your new parish for more effective ministry by addressing financial needs, sharing resources and allowing your clergy to focus on the spiritual work for which they were ordained. With your faith in Jesus and empowered by the Holy Spirit, I invite you to warmly welcome and serve each other as you become one parish family.

On May 7, 2020, petitions were presented requesting that the parishes of Saint Colman, Turtle Creek; Good Shepherd, Braddock; Saint John Fisher, Churchill; Saint Jude the Apostle, Wilmerding; Madonna del Castello, Swissvale; Saint Maurice, Forest Hills; and Word of God, Swissvale, be merged into one territorial parish to serve the combined boundaries of the seven parishes. This petition was signed by you, the Administrator of all seven parishes, along with members of the Pastoral and Finance Councils of all seven parishes. In light of that request and following consultation with the Priest Council, I signed a decree on May 22, 2020 which canonically established the new territorial parish of Saint Joseph the Worker.

In accord with Canon 523 of the *Code of Canon Law*, I am pleased to appoint you Pastor of the newly established Saint Joseph the Worker Parish, East Suburban Pittsburgh, for a term of six years, effective on Wednesday, July 1, 2020. At the same time, because the parishes of Saint Colman, Turtle Creek; Good Shepherd, Braddock; Saint John Fisher, Churchill; Saint Jude the Apostle, Wilmerding; Madonna del Castello, Swissvale; Saint Maurice, Forest Hills; and Word of God, Swissvale, will cease to exist, your role as Administrator will come to an end.

I recognize your willingness to accept this new responsibility and have every confidence that you will provide appropriate pastoral leadership at the new Saint Joseph the Worker Parish. I am also convinced that your parishioners will cooperate with you. I know that you will assist them to grow in holiness and to work for the building up of God's Kingdom in the Church of Pittsburgh. I ask that you give special attention to promoting and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life in our diocese.

In giving you this appointment, I extend my sincere gratitude for your fidelity to the priesthood and your share in my ministry to the faithful to this diocese.



CAMPUS CLEAN UP AT ST. MAURICE CHURCH


